
DIRECTOR'S NOTE


When I met Robert Wyatt and Alfreda Benge, accompanying some journalist friends to interview them, their approachability surprised me and the idea of making a film inspired by their story began to brew inside me. While Robert told us all about Mallorca, where he discovered his musical vocation, I took out my notebook and drew him a portrait with all the love in the world.

Wyatt's successful career began with **Soft Machine**, which, along with **Pink Floyd**, became one of the most influential bands of the following decade. After a tumultuous tour with Jimmy Hendrix throughout the US and a successful career, Wyatt was expelled from the band he had founded due to his problems with alcohol.

That was a hard blow in his life but, unfortunately, it would not be the last. He participated in other bands but, when he was preparing what was to be his third album, something happened that would change everything forever. In **1973**, at a party to honor Pink Floyd, Robert Wyatt got completely wasted and fell from the fourth floor, breaking his spine and becoming paraplegic. After three months bedridden, he received a wheelchair and discovered an old piano in the visiting room. That's where he finished tinkering with the songs he had composed before the accident, and where *Rock Bottom*, considered to be one of the best records of the 20th century, was composed.

The night of the interview, we ate a lot, sang together and laughed heartily, but Robert did not drink a single drop of alcohol. According to Wyatt himself, the accident that nearly killed him **actually saved his life**, as he had to change his lifestyle and quit drinking forever. That night, I knew what I wanted to do: an animated film to illustrate the music of *Rock Bottom*.





In addition to its unquestionable artistic value, *Rock Bottom* is a life lesson. Great artists such as Julian Schnabel, Bob Wilson or Brian Eno wanted to adapt it, but the technical and argumental difficulty of the work has made it impossible to date. Facing this undertaking is like trying to decipher a hieroglyphic full of unexpected turns, starting with the title: **"to hit rock bottom"** defines the degradation of someone who falls into extreme vices and passions, or who hits a moral low point. It's also a play on words: since it's a rock album, it could mean "degraded rock", and it also refers to the bottom of the sea. The lyrics speak of the creatures that inhabit the deep sea as an expression of hidden feelings. Therefore, much of the film takes place in Mallorca, whose landscape becomes another protagonist.


The film's script unravels a beautiful and terrible love story articulated from the themes of the album and some pieces of his other works, where the euphoria and anguish of artistic creation, the unconscious fascination with drugs and the disenchantment with routine and physical and mental degradation are discussed.

Rock Bottom can be understood on three different levels: through a series of real artists who appear in the film, we learn about the untold story of the hippy movement in Europe, which serves to draw a poetic and dreamlike portrait of one of the most iconic movements of the 20th century that has most influenced our collective imagination of youth culture.



With a degree in Fine Arts from the Faculty of Sant Carles of the UPV (Valencia, Spain), she has produced and directed several animated short films shot in 35mm. Among them, ¿Con qué la lavaré? (2003), which has won several national and international awards, such as the 1st Teddy Bear Award for Best Short Film at the 54th Berlin International Film Festival (Berlinale), or the 1st Prize for Best Short Film at ANIMADRID (2004). The short film was also selected in renowned international festivals such as SUNDANCE (2005) and ANNECY (2004).

Her animated short film shot in 35mm, *Ex-Libris* (2009), has won several awards, and has also been nominated for Best Animated Short Film at the 25th Spanish Film Academy Awards (GOYA AWARDS).

Maria Trenor has just finished her latest short film, ¿Dónde estabas tú? (2020), which has participated in international film festivals and won the WIA Diversity Award at the SPARK International Animation Festival (Canada).

María is a professor of Audiovisual Media at the School of Art and Design of Valencia (Spain). Thanks to her extensive experience in the world of animation, she has been invited to participate in conferences and activities organized by universities such as UCLM, UPV, Universitat de Palermo or Universidad Carlos III de Madrid; or by financial institutions such as CajAstur and CAM. She has also collaborated in several publications about cinema and animation, such as "25 años inquietos Cinema Jove, Festival Internacional de Cine, 1986-2010", by A. Llorens and J. Castillejo, or "Mamá, quiero ser artista: Entrevista a mujeres del cine de animación", by I. Herguera and B. Vicario.
